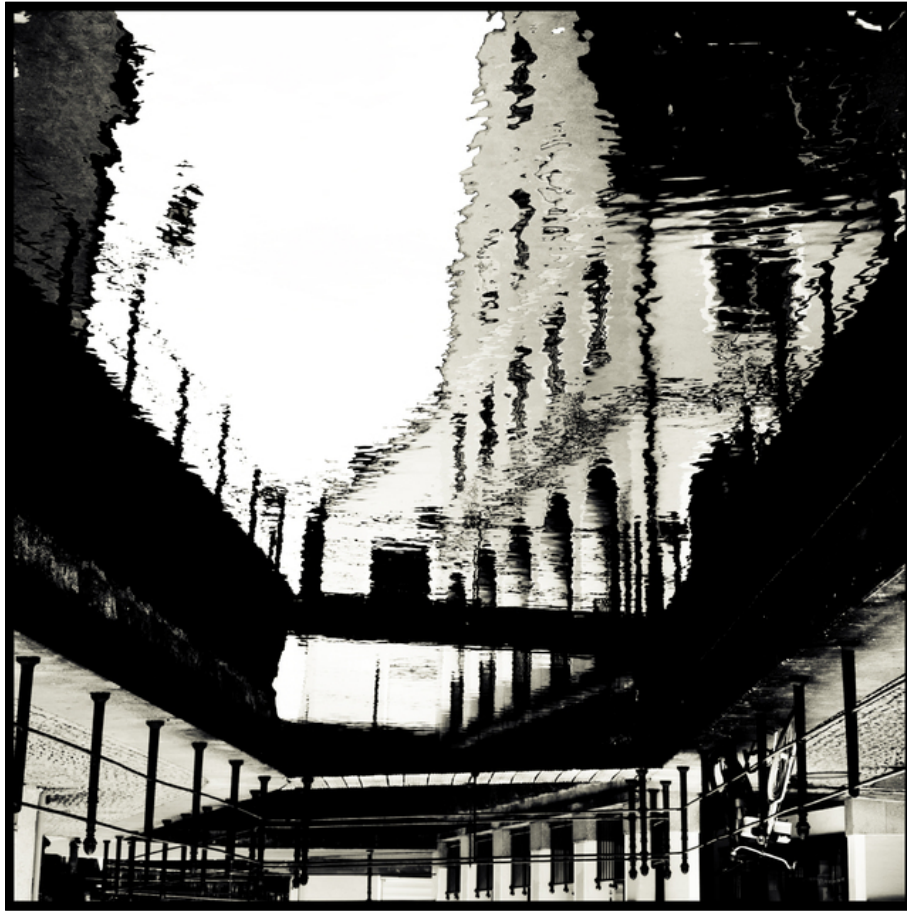

Picture Description¹⁾

Analysis¹⁾
